

## **Vacancy at N/a'an Ku Sê Wildlife Experience – Harnas Guest Farm**

An exciting and challenging opportunity is available for an **Equine Coordinator** to join our team. The successful incumbent will be based at N/a'an Ku Sê – Harnas Guest Farm, No. 418 Gobabis District, Omaheke Region, Namibia.

### **Overview**

The Equine Coordinator will take full responsibility for the day-to-day care and well-being of horses at Harnas. This role combines hands-on animal care, people management (particularly of volunteers and guests), and operational coordination to ensure the safety, health, and effective use of the horses on-site. The coordinator will also play a key role in delivering a meaningful experience for guests and volunteers, particularly during outrides and educational sessions.

### **Main responsibilities (but not limited to):**

- Coordinate, assign, and supervise daily equine-related tasks with volunteers.
- Manage horse care routines, including feeding, grooming, exercise, and routine health checks.
- Safely fetch and release horses from the veld and paddocks.
- Observe and manage herd dynamics to ensure safe interactions between horses.
- Lead and supervise guest and volunteer outrides, including sunset rides.
- Maintain riding arenas, paddocks, and water troughs.
- Ensure all tack and stable equipment is kept clean, functional, and safe.
- Oversee basic weed control and general maintenance in and around horse areas.
- Monitor and record horse behaviour and health issues, and report to the Equine Manager and onsite Vet.
- Assist with temperature checks during high-risk disease seasons (e.g., African Horse Sickness).
- Maintain clear and regular communication with the General Manager, Equine Manager, and other relevant departments.

### **Job requirements and skills:**

- At least 1 year of hands-on experience working with horses.
- Proven ability to safely manage and care for multiple horses.
- Understanding of horse behaviour and safety best practices.
- Ability to manage and guide volunteers and guests.
- Flexible schedule, including availability on weekends and public holidays.
- First aid training (human and/or equine) – advantageous.
- Experience in riding and leading trail rides – advantageous.
- Passionate about horses and committed to their welfare.
- Experienced and confident around horses, with an understanding of herd dynamics.
- Able to lead and motivate international volunteers, many of whom may have limited horse experience.
- Calm under pressure, assertive, and highly safety-conscious.
- Strong interpersonal and communication skills.
- Well-organised, reliable, and able to work independently with minimal supervision.
- Physically fit and comfortable working in outdoor environments and various weather conditions.
- Namibian citizen
